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Hong Kong Academy of Medicine (HKAM)



- Established in 1993
- The only statutory body in Hong Kong to train, assess and accredit specialists
- Admit registered medical and dental practitioners as Fellows if they fulfill the training and examination requirements of the Academy

Roles of HKAM

- Develop and uphold the training standard of specialists
- Maintain the standard of specialist continuing medical education (CME) / continuous professional development (CPD) in Hong Kong
- Responsible for (i) professionalisation and development of specialties, (ii) future development of all specialists and their life-long learning



An Academy, with its own governance structure, is unique in regulating the profession and setting its standards and directions, but also in nurturing the role of the profession within the community and nurturing our Fellows to be fit for purpose in the community.





- Adopt labour-intensive mentoring approach in medical training, also for nursing and midwifery






The aim in training is evidenceinformed practice and patientcentred practice.






Hong Kong Medical Journal


- HKAM's flagship bimonthly medical journal
