

Ten years ago when SARS visited Hong Kong, local nurses had shown to world their strong sense of professionalism and commitment to care in times of adversity. Today, we continue to feel proud of our nurses for these admirable attributes that sustain the healthcare system for quality service provision. Today, Hong Kong does not encounter the issue of attracting new blood to the nursing profession as evidenced by the popularity of nursing programmes for both enrolled and registered nurse preparation, but we are facing the nursing issue of low staff morale and high turnover intention.

Recent surveys on nurses' perceived work environments consistently revealed that local nurses place a high value on professionalism but they are less satisfied with their work conditions due to constraints in healthcare practices and inadequate staffing and resource. The majority of nurses agree that nursing is challenging because of its work nature which involves people's lives, health, and wellbeing. They express that the more they can do for the patient, the higher they find satisfaction at work. They would feel good as well as welcome the experiential opportunities in gaining knowledge and competencies that can improve patient care. However, they meet with a mismatch in the reality of practice due to multifaceted responsibilities as well as misalignment of work assignments with professional competencies, rendering them unable to put the priorities to direct patient care management, the facet of responsibility that they value most. Indeed, confusion about the roles and competencies expected of nurses with different credentials is not a surprise as Hong Kong has yet to formalize a professional preparation and advancement structure that can duly recognize nurses' levels of education and clinical expertise. Having made this note, I am optimistic about the future of nursing because our strong sense of professionalism, as exemplified by the setting up of the Provisional Hong Kong Academy of Nursing, is driving the change.

My congratulations to all fellows who receive their conferment this year, and hopefully, in concerted effort, we will witness the transition of the Academy from the current provisional status to become an enduring establishment.

NURSING CHARTER ON TOBACCO CONTROL

NURSING CHARTER ON TOBACCO CONTROL

The nurses pledge to

- be role models of being non-smokers
- assess and arrange a smoker to quit smoking
- give health advice on the harms of smoking to the public.

It is evident that smoking, either active or passive, is hazardous to health and earlier death can be prevented if smoking has been quitted. The healthcare resources are huge to manage the smoking-related diseases. In fact, the low smoking rate of Hong Kong, at 11.1 % as at 2011, must be one of the very crucial factors to make the longevity of Hong Kong people being the first, if not the first, in the world. Needless to say, the benefits brought by a smoke-free environment are tangible and enormous.

The nurses are the largest group of health-care workers in the industry and our efforts play an important role in helping the people acquire better health and higher quality of life if a smoke-free Hong Kong is promoted through the dedicated efforts of the nurses. Recognizing the indispensable role of the nurses in the subject, the Hong Kong Council on Smoking and Health (COSH) mastered the opportunity, after the Provisional Hong Kong Academy of Nursing (PHKAN) was established in 2012, to start discussing with the PHKAN on our concerted efforts of the 14 Colleges of the PHKAN on tobacco control. A steering group was formed afterwards to formulate a plan for a charter, which will be signed by the Presidents of the 14 Colleges, to be witnessed by the Secretary for Food and Health and the Chairman of the COSH, with the support for it from the Hospital Authority and the Department of Health, on 4 May 2013. With the funding support from the COSH, various projects, focusing on quitting smoking, public education, nurses training and survey, will be executed by the 14 Colleges after the signing of the charter. The details of the programmes are listed below to achieve the pledge of the Charter.

It is expected the smoker patients, the public & the nurses will be benefitted from the various programmes. We shall be close to the vision of a smoke-free Hong Kong!

Nurses' Participation on Smoking Cessation: a National Survey

Aim: To investigate nurses' participation in smoking cessation intervention and the enhancing factors and barriers of this practice. This is a collaborative study of the COSH, PHKAN and WHO Collaborating Centre for Community Health Service, School of Nursing, HK PolyU.

Main objectives:

- 1. To examine nurses' participation of smoking cessation intervention (5A's) in their clinical setting
- 2. To identify predictors of practice nurses' intention to adopt a new smoking cessation intervention: 3A's (Ask, Advise and Arrange).

Other objectives:

- 3. To explore the enhancing factors and barriers of nurses in identifying and managing tobacco dependence of their smoking clients
- 4. To understand the meaning of helping clients quit smoking from nurses who have provided smoking cessation interventions.
- 5. To understand the meaning of quitting smoking, and the effects on perceived well being and family life, from the perspective of former smokers.

Methods:

As this study is in collaboration with PHKAN, there will be direct access to nurses in the 14 Academy Colleges. Questionnaires will be distributed to all practicing nurses. The questionnaire will be developed according to the above mentioned objectives, and will be collected by a Research Assistant, who will also be responsible for analyzing the data. Qualitative data will be obtained from nurses or former smokers via interviews, in exploring the set objectives#3-5.

Nurses' Development – to address the Millennium Development Goals – the Regional perspective

Of the eight Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) agreed to by world leaders at the United Nations (UN) General Assembly in 2000 to alleviate extreme poverty by 2015, three of them are specifically related to health. In Hong Kong, while there is undoubted progress in achieving the MDGs, a number of challenges remain. Despite the fact that the maternal mortality ratio is generally on a decreasing trend, it has fluctuated between 1.0 and 11.2 per 100,000 live births from 1981 to 2012 The re-emergence of communicable diseases and the new global epidemic of non-communicable diseases (NCDs) have become a significant threat to human health and development.

As the largest group of health care professionals in the world and the ones who spend the most time with patients during the care process, nurses play a key role in the achievement of the MDGs. Through enhancement of professional knowledge and skills, better collaboration with other healthcare professions, nurses may break through existing barriers and challenges to deliver the MDGs and meet the health needs of the marginalized and underprivileged communities in the Region. Nurses' engagement in health advocacy and lobbying will also shape the new agenda for the health and wellbeing of the global community.

Nurses' Contribution towards Millennium Development Goals – Perspective from a frontline Nurse Consultant

In 2000, eight millennium development goals (MDG) were developed to eradicate poverty and improve the well-being using a holistic approach.

Out of the 8 MDGs, Goal 4 is targeted to reduce mortality rate of children under five years of age.

It is believed that nurses play an important role in disease prevention, health promotion, life-saving intervention and rehabilitation through a holistic, interdisciplinary approach. As child cannot be separated from his/her family, thus reduction in child mortality rate could only be successful with involvement of the family taking both ethnicity and cultural aspect into consideration. As a result, nurses have to take a family-centered approach during the care delivery process. They have to empower and partner with the family thus contribute to better child health and reduction in death among children under age five.

Healthcare and societal advancement have resulted in marked decrease in child mortality in developed countries. Nursing practice evolves with time. To this end, it is therefore especially important for nurses to be competent in technological sense and knowledge base, to adopt the best available evidence and to strive for clinical excellence.

Tobacco Control in the Millennium

Since the enactment of the Smoking (Public Health) Ordinance in 1982, the Government has adopted a progressive and multi-pronged approach to tighten the control on smoking. These tobacco control measures echoed the six MPOWER measures released by the World Health Organization (WHO) in 2008, which are proven to be the effective ways to combat the global tobacco epidemic.

WHO emphasizes the important role of healthcare professionals in the global tobacco control effort and they are at the forefront of safeguarding public health. Nurses in Hong Kong are dedicated to and impactful in building a smoke-free Hong Kong. For example, they supported the expansion of no-smoking areas and raising tobacco tax, as well as encouraging smoking patients to kick the habit.

Hong Kong Council on Smoking and Health (COSH), together with The Provisional Hong Kong Academy of Nursing (PHKAN), are going to launch the Nurses Initiatives on Tobacco Control to show our commitment. A series of programmes will be organized to gather support from all levels of nurses and motivate them to take a proactive role on tobacco control; to promote smoke-free messages to the general public, as well as to facilitate the frontline nurses as change agent to encourage the patients to quit smoking.

Introduction of PHKAN

The Provisional Hong Kong Academy of Nursing (PHKAN) as incorporated in October 2011, is an independent institution to organize, monitor, assess and accredit all nursing specialist training programs and to oversee the provision of continuing specialist nursing education. The PHKAN is charged with the responsibility to regulate the practices of Advanced Practice Nurses and to safeguard the public's right to receive safe and quality health care services.

Mission

The PHKAN is to establish the Hong Kong Academy of Nursing which is to promote excellence in nursing and health care in Hong Kong through regulating specialist nursing practice and education.

Objectives

The PHKAN is set with the following objectives as stipulated in the memorandum and articles of association:

- 1. To promote the advancement of the art and science of nursing;
- 2. To foster the development of continuing nursing education;
- 3. To promote integrity, ethical conduct and standards in the practice of nursing and its specialties;
- 4. To promote the improvement of health care for HK citizens;
- 5. To foster a spirit of collaboration among nursing and health care practitioners;
- 6. To facilitate the exchange of information and ideas in nursing and matters concerning the nursing profession.

Functions

In order to achieve the above objectives, the PHKAN has the following functions:

- 1. To set, monitor and enforce the standards of Academy Colleges;
- 2. To accredit Academy Colleges in reference to the set standards;
- 3. To support and foster development of advanced nursing practice in Hong Kong;
- 4. To educate the public regarding the roles and benefits of specialization in nursing.

The Council

The PHKAN is an autonomous, professional organization advised by a Council, which is made up of members of academy colleges and 2 lay persons. Each Council Member shall hold office for an initial term of 3 years. On 18 September 2012, the 1st Annual General Meeting was hosted. The new 17 Council Members (2012-14) were elected and the office bearers and committee chairs were also confirmed.

Membership

1. Institutional Member

PHKAN has recognized 14 Academy Colleges as Institutional Members. These are registered organizations to provide certification of individuals as advanced practice nurses in specialties recognized by the PHKAN.

2. Fellow Members

PHKAN has 28 Founding Members who have contributed to the development of the Hong Kong Academy of Nursing Preparatory Committee and the subsequent establishment of the PHKAN.

On 12 May, 1496 advanced practice nurses from 14 Colleges were admitted as Fellows under the grandfathering scheme. These are registered nurse / registered midwives with over 15 years in specialized practice and demonstrated significant contribution to specialty service development.

3. Honorary Fellow Members

The PHKAN takes great pride to have admitted 8 renowned individuals in 2012 as Honorary Fellows who have contributed to the establishment of the Academy and have offered their expertise to enhance the development of professional nursing in Hong Kong.

Achievements in the Past Year

1. PHKAN Office

With the genuine support from the Princess Margaret Hospital (PMH) and Hospital Authority, PHKAN has been licensed the use of the nursing school office at PMH as the operating office for the PHKAN and Academy Colleges. Renovation works had been completed in last November. It provides offices for the Secretariat and Academy Colleges, as well as the meeting places for our Committees and Fellow members.

2. Operation Handbook

Since the PHKAN is to establish the Hong Kong Academy of Nursing (HKAN), The PHKAN Council serves to undertake preparatory work in constructing the infrastructure and PHKAN regulatory mechanism and to make way for the impending HKAN. The handbook details the operation structure of PHKAN with its missions, objectives, functions, membership and academy colleges.

3. Accreditation Manual

Following the incorporation of PHKAN on 6 October 2011, the Accreditation Committee was set up to set standards and criteria for the accreditation of professional organizations to be Academy Colleges. In order to ensure the Academy College has attained the required standards for a nursing specialty, an Accreditation Manual has been developed to stipulate the systems required for design and implementation of education program, examination and certification for the advanced practice of the specialty concerned.

4. Membership Database

In order to maintain a versatile membership system, the Registration and Membership Committee has designed a database for all Fellow members for PHKAN as well as for individual Academy Colleges. The database serves as nursing specialist registry as well as monitoring tool for continuing nursing education of the Fellow members.

5. Connection with Fellow Members

With the large number of potential and admitted Fellow members of PHKAN, maintaining continuous exchange with members has always been the target of the Council. The PHKAN has committed to publish Newsletters at regular basis to provide progress and up-to-date information to members. The PHKAN website has undergone a revamp to constructing a friendly platform to enhance interactions with members. Apart from disseminating information, visit to the HK Academy of Medicine, open forums and sharing seminars had also been organized.

6. Pursuance for Charitable Status

Upon the incorporation of the PHKAN, application to Inland Revenue Department (IRD) for the charitable status under IRD 88 had been made. With reference from the HK Academy of Medicine, we shall provide the information to IRD as required. The charitable status is important for tax exemption and to raise funds for the future development of the PHKAN.

7. Participation in Policy Issues

As recognized to be one of the key stakeholders in formulating healthcare policies, PHKAN has been invited to be members of the Steering Committees on Strategic Review on Healthcare Manpower Planning and Professional Development, and Review of the Regulation of Private Health Facilities. For issues interested to the health of people of Hong King, PHKAN has submitted views on Regulation of medical beauty treatments/ procedures; Hong Kong Code of Marketing and Quality of Formula Milk and Related Products, and Food Products for Infants & Young Children.

8. Community Involvement

One of the objectives of the PHKAN is to enrich the public knowledge on health. The PHKAN collaborated with all nursing communities in Hong Kong has organized public health programs to promote the World Health Day every year. On 15 April 2012, Health Carnival – Good Health Add Years to Life had brought all specialties together to conduct health talks and check with educational booths for the general public in Shatin New Town Plaza. The 2013 Health Carnival on 6 April has continued to raise public awareness of heart attacks and strokes along with World Health Organization's theme: High Blood Pressure. As from 4 May, a series of events to promote a smoke-free community will be launched after the signing of the Nursing Charter on Tobacco Control co-organized by the Hong Kong Council on Smoking and Health.

9. Towards a Statutory Hong Kong Academy of Nursing

The PHKAN exists solely for the purpose of the establishment of the Hong Kong Academy of Nursing (HKAN). The PHKAN serves an important function to undertake preparatory work in constructing the infrastructure and regulatory mechanism and to make way for the impending HKAN. The President and Council Members had meetings with nursing associations and unions, the Secretary and Under Secretary of Food and Health to solicit their support and share our vision and mission. A Task Force has also been formed to work on a Private Member's Bill.

he Provisional Hong Kong Academy of Nursing has admitted Ms. Jessie L Childe as an Honorary Fellow. Ms Childe started her training in 1953 in Queen Mary Hospital. She was awarded a 2-year scholarship to study at The Royal College of Nursing in London, UK and obtained the London University Diploma for Sister-Tutor in 1965. After returning to Hong Kong, she dedicated herself to nursing education for 30 years. She had been appointed School Principal of Queen Mary Hospital School of General Nursing in 1982 till 1989. Before her retirement, she worked as Principal of School of Post Basic Nursing at Queen Elizabeth Hospital from 1989 to 1995. She was one of the pioneers in promoting nursing education at the tertiary level. She participated as a member of the Steering Committee for the HKU Extra-Mural Nursing Degree Programme to pioneer the nursing education at tertiary level. Her involvement in development nursing in Hong Kong is impressive. Just to name a few, Ms Childe was an executive committee member & Chairman of Educational Subcommittee of Hong Kong Government Nurses Association. She was elected the Founding Chairman of Hong Kong Society for Nursing Education in 1986, and continues to be the Honorary Advisor currently. Just prior to the advent of the introduction of computerization in medicine and nursing in Hong Kong, she became also the Founding Chairman of Nursing Info (HK) in 1991, collaborated with the HK Society of Medical Informatics as member of their organizing and programme committees (1992-1994). She was awarded 40-year long service award from Hospital Authority in 1994.

Ms Childe immigrated to Vancouver, Canada after retirement. She continued her contribution as a professional nurse in Canada, including being an elected President of the Hong Kong Nurses Association of BC, a speaker of seminars on brain health for seniors and a trained facilitator for the Chinatown Care Givers Support Group (2005-2010). In 2009, she was awarded a post-bachelor Diploma in Gerontology at Simon Fraser University. Ms Childe's talents and zest for art and Chinese painting also led her to be appointed as a Director and then Gallery Chair at the Burnaby Arts Council. Ms. Childe became a permanent artist at Eileen Fong Gallery, later known as Aurora Gallery. Ms Childe, an artist after retirement in Canada but a nurse all of her life, has groomed and nurtured many nurse leaders in Hong Kong.

近 時香港護理專科學院已確認郭燕紅女士為榮譽院士。郭女士是現任衛生 部醫政司副司長、歷任衛生部醫政司護理管理處處長、中華護理學會副 秘書長和《中國醫院》特邀策劃顧問。1989 年畢業於中國協和醫科大學,是 我國恢復高等護理專業教育後的首批畢業生,曾赴美國亞利桑那大學研修護 理管理。郭副司長多年在衛生部醫政司從事護理行政管理工作,近年來直接 參與《護士條例》、《中國護理事業發展規劃綱要(2005—2010年)》、《中 國護理事業發展規劃綱要(2011-2015年)》及護理相關標準、規範的起草和 制定工作,在專業刊物上發表多篇有關護理管理的文章。在公立醫院改革過 程中,她大力推進優質護理服務,以改革臨床護理模式為切入點,深化護理 服務內涵;同時,加強臨床護理重點專科建設,提升護理專業技術水準。她 對護理專業的熱誠和抱負鼓舞並感動了不少護理人員,並成為眾人的學習榜 樣和追隨目標。郭副司長與香港的護理界交往頻繁,致力推動兩岸三地護理 訊息交流及發展,國家層面的醫療改革和健康政策給與香港護理同業很多啟 發。中國擁有全球最多人口,中國民眾的健康影響著全球的健康,中國的護 士在維持國民健康方面,郭副司長的領導起了關鍵的作用。



Dr. HUGHES, Frances

The Provisional Hong Kong Academy of Nursing has admitted Dr Frances Hughes as an Honorary Fellow. Dr Hughes is currently the Chief Nursing and Midwifery Officer for Queensland Health. She is highly experienced in the development of health policy particularly in the field of nursing and mental health, research, and global health. She has provided invaluable advise and insightful comments that contribute a great deal to the work of the PHKAN.

Prof. MCBRIDE, Angela B.

The Provisional Hong Kong Academy of Nursing has admitted Prof. Angela Barron McBride as an Honorary Fellow. Prof. McBride is Distinguished Professor and University Dean Emerita at Indiana University School of Nursing; she is also a member of the Indiana University Health Board, and chairs the board's Committee on Quality and Patient Safety. Having wide-ranging knowledge of women's health, psychology of parenthood and psychiatric nursing, she has published extensively and earned many prestigious book awards over the years. Along with literary awards she has been honored with many other awards, for example, Award of the American Psychological Association's Division on Health Psychology and the Melva Jo Hendrix Award for Leadership of the International Society for Psychiatric Nurses. Prof. McBride's years of dedication to fostering both nursing education and leadership also brought her the President's Medal for "sustained academic excellence" awarded by Indiana University.

Prof. McBride is an active leader serving on various nursing organizations and programs in the United States. In recent years, she has focused her scholarly attention on leadership development, publishing The Growth and Development of Nurse Leaders in 2011, to help other nurses orchestrate their careers. Her generous sharing of experiences and knowledge has been instrumental in advancing global nursing practice. Hong Kong nurses also benefit from the distinguished leadership of Prof. McBride. She has been an advisor to the PHKAN since of the time when it was a preparatory committee in the early 2000s. As a past president of the American Academy of Nursing, Prof. McBride has inspired and championed the noble vision of the PHKAN to promote advanced nursing practice and the well-being of the people nurses serve.

Prof. YEOH Eng Kiong, OBE, GBS, JP

The Provisional Hong Kong Academy of Nursing has admitted Professor Eng Kiong Yeoh, OBE, G.B.S., JP, as an Honorary Fellow. Professor Yeoh is well known in the public health arena and in the government. He has served with distinction in many public organizations, just to name a few, the first Chief Executive of the Hospital Authority, Hong Kong, first medically qualified Secretary for Health and Welfare, and later first non-civil servant Secretary for Health, Welfare and Food of the Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region.

Professor Yeoh is currently Professor of Jockey Club School of Public Health and Primary Care, Head of Division of Health System, Policy and Management at the Chinese University of Hong Kong. He has published many articles in health systems and policy. His rich experiences as a health care executive have added weight to his scholarly work that informs practice. Indeed he was the pioneer in establishing the Hospital Authority which values quality staff, advocates patient-centered care and safeguards quality outcomes. Professor Yeoh has a vision to build a system that provides seamless integrated care for all. He believes this can only be achieved through team work and the strengthening of community care in parallel with hospital care. Nurses being the key partners in health promotion and maintenance support seamless care that interfaces services between the hospital and community. Professor Yeoh's dedication to improving the public health care services for the community has made him a great supporter for nurses and their contribution to promote people's health.
