PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

It is my honor and privilege to address you as the second President of The Hong Kong Academy of Nursing (HKAN). The HKAN is in its sixth year, which is young in terms of an organisation's life span, but it has a noble heritage, built over a decade under the leadership of founding president Dr. Susie LUM and a group of nurse leaders. The HKAN is gradually gaining recognition and support from policy makers, key stakeholders, and her local and international counterparts.

Every year, the HKAN has a Fellowship Conferment Ceremony that recognizes nurses' contribution, particularly achievements in advanced practice in different specialty areas. This year we have 16 earned Fellows from 5 Academy Colleges. These individuals have proven themselves in attaining the advanced practicing level of competence stipulated by their Academy Colleges. We feel proud of these young Fellows who aspire to achieve the best in their specialty practice. There are also 3 Honorary Fellows to be inducted, in recognition of their contribution to the development of nursing in Hong Kong in the areas of education, emergency nursing and palliative care.

It is the mission of the HKAN to strive for the statutory status of specialty nurses practicing at the advanced level. Is the regulation of advanced practicing nurses a means or an end? It is an end but also a means, aiming to safeguard quality service and public safety. The process of achieving the aim encourages dialogue among the service, education and professional bodies to arrive at mutual expectations, guiding continued education for nurses who aspire to excel in their specialty areas. In a developed and civilized society, there should be systems and regulations to ensure the proper exercise of rights and responsibilities for the welfare of all people concerned. There is ample quantitative evidence demonstrating that advanced practice nurses contribute to patients' outcomes, including symptom management, complication prevention and reducing hospital use. Qualitatively, there are many successful stories about these nurses. To name a few, a wound nurse salvages the legs of patients with chronic infections to preserve their quality of life; an orthopaedic nurse advocates for a patient to choose the appropriate surgical procedure and rehabilitation plan so that he can regain the ability to work and resume his job to maintain his livelihood; and a palliative care nurse ensures the dignity and quality of death of a dying patient, minimizes symptom distress and facilitates the grieving process of family members. There are many more of these stories to tell. The HKAN will continue to act as an advocate of advanced practice nursing through the certification of qualified practitioners and at the same time, strive for statutory status in order to recognize these practitioners and protect the public.

The HKAN is charged with the responsibility to regulate the practices of Advanced Practice Nurses, to safeguard the public's right and to receive safe and quality health care services.

Vision

The Hong Kong Academy of Nursing is committed to strive for excellence in achieving safe and quality healthcare that can benchmark with international standards, through regulating advanced nursing practice.

Mission

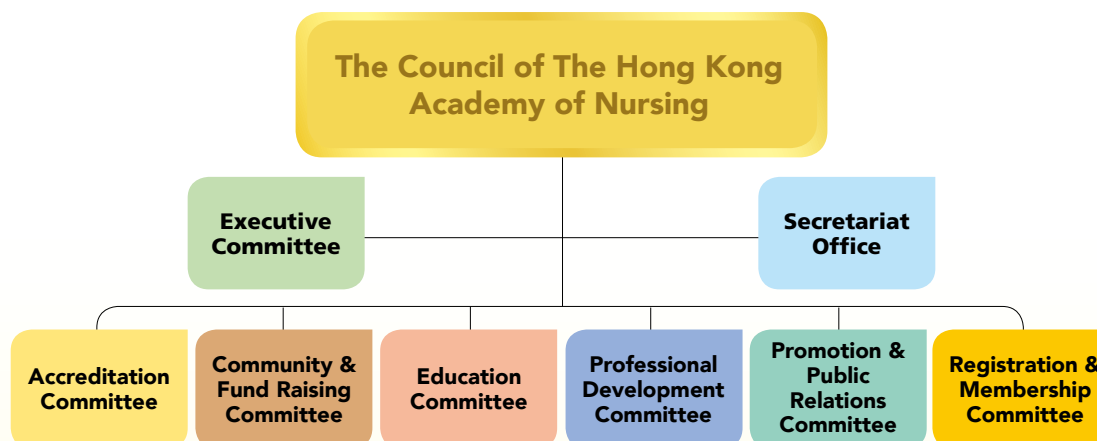
1. To establish a statutory credentialing system to protect the safety of the public and to legitimize advanced nursing practice;
2. To increase the visibility and professional impact of advanced nursing practice;
3. To shape health policy and in anticipating public interest and concerns;
4. Foster transdisciplinary and intersectoral collaboration to enhance care quality in achieving efficient, effective and best care for the community;
5. Networking with global partners to foster advanced practice nursing development within and outside Hong Kong.

Categories of Membership

- 1. Institutional Member** - Academy College recognized by the Council of HKAN
- 2. Ordinary Member** - RN/RM completed courses and training prescribed; passed examination, nomination by Institutional Members and recognized by HKAN
- 3. Fellow Member** - Ordinary Member who passed examination or assessment recognized and nominated by respective Institutional Members and recognized by HKAN
- 4. Honorary Fellow Member** - any person whose academic achievement, prominence or contribution recognized by the Council of HKAN.

Membership in 2017

1. Institutional Members

HKAN has recognized 14 Academy Colleges as Institutional Members. These are registered organizations providing certification of individuals as advanced practice nurses in specialties recognized by the HKAN.

2. Ordinary Members

We are pleased to have the second group of Ordinary Members admitted from Hong Kong College of Medical Nursing, Hong Kong College of Midwives, Hong Kong College of Nursing & Health Care Management and Hong Kong College of Paediatrics Nursing in 2016 as they have satisfied the specialty training curriculum and examination as stipulated by the Colleges. There are a total of 24 Ordinary Members as at 31 December 2016.

3. Fellow Members

Since 2016, HKAN has admitted Fellow Members by examination and assessment conducted by individual colleges. There are a total of 2920 Fellow Members as at 31 December 2016.

We are pleased to have 16 Fellow Members admitted from Hong Kong College of Critical Care Nursing, Hong Kong College of Medical Nursing, Hong Kong College of Midwives, Hong Kong College of Nursing & Health Care Management and Hong Kong College of Paediatric Nursing in 2017.

HKAN takes great pride to have admitted renowned individuals as Honorary Fellows who have contributed to the establishment of the Academy and had offered their expertise to enhance the development of professional nursing locally and internationally. Achievements and Events in 2016/2017

In the 5th anniversary year, the Academy of Nursing has had many achievements that broaden its standing in the community.

The first Charity Nourishing Feast 2016 was held at Hong Kong Jockey Club, Happy Valley Racecourse on 27 May 2016. We were honored in having Mrs. Regina LEUNG, wife of the Chief Executive; as the patron of the event and Professor Alice CHIU as the Founding Fund Raising Consultant of the Academy. Mr. CHAN Chik Hon and Professor FENG Jiu jointly tailor-made a nutritious menu with “Preserving Good Health” 養生 as the theme. The net surplus of the Charity Dinner was approximately HK\$660,000.

Another breakthrough for the Academy was hosting the 9th International Council of Nurses (ICN) International Nurse Practitioner / Advanced Practice Nursing Network (INP/APNN) Conference held on 9-11 September 2016, in collaboration with College of Nursing Hong Kong and World Health Organization Collaborating Centre for Community Health Services in the Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Centre. The theme was “Advancing nursing, Advancing health: Emerging possibilities”. There were over 900 delegates from 26 countries, 56 concurrent sessions with excellent and high standard paper presentations. Delegates had the opportunity to learn Chinese cultures in the Hong Kong Night on 10 September following a fabulous and enjoyable Gala Dinner night on 9 September. We were very thankful to all the organizing committee members and volunteers in making this event a very successful one.

On 19 November 2016, the Academy started its 5th anniversary celebration with an inspiring professional seminar by Dr. LI Kwok Tung, Donald, President of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine and Honorary Advisor of the Hong Kong Academy of Nursing. The other highlight of the evening was the Fellow Recognition Award ceremony where we had 11 Fellows receiving Gold Merit Award, 34 Fellows receiving Merit Award and 45 Fellows receiving Certificate of Recognition, all having demonstrated dedication and contributions to the profession and the community. Last, but not least, the evening dinner was celebrated with over 250 guests and ended in the midst of fun, laughter and photo-taking.

As an annual activity, the Academy had its Strategic Planning Workshop 2017 on 7 January in Sai Kung.

The theme was “Building the New Milestones of Hong Kong Academy of Nursing Together” and around 50 representatives from 14 Academy Colleges attended. Participants had good discussions, sincere sharing, and were able to set strategy goals for their own College at the end of the day. We were also greatly encouraged by Prof. Sophia CHAN, Under Secretary of Food and Health, HKSAR Govt., for coming in the midst of her tight schedule.

Communication with Stakeholders

A Task Force on Specialisation of Nursing Practice was set up by the Food and Health Bureau, facilitating communication among stakeholders and the Academy with regular meetings. The Academy also has regular meetings with Hospital Authority (HA) and Department of Health (DH) to explore possible directions of developing advanced practicing nurses in the health sector.

Active Participation in Public Concerns

In supporting the government, the Academy had signed as organization to promote organ donation in the “Organ Donation Promotion Charter Launching Ceremony” 「器官捐贈推廣約章啟動禮」 on 25 June 2016 and actively promulgate and educate the public in all their functions throughout the year.

The Hong Kong Academy of Nursing, Hong Kong College of Family Medicine and the Hong Kong College of Community Medicine jointly organized a press conference to alert the public on the harmful use of alcohol on the International NO Alcohol Day on 2 October 2016. The position statement was broadly publicized on the newspapers and electronic media.

Ms. Alice SHAM represented the Academy to attend the special meeting of LegCo’s Panel on Health Services on “The Hong Kong Code of Marketing of Formula Milk and Related Products, and Food Products for Infants & Young Children” on April 2017 and presented the view of HKAN.

Education Committee

The Chairlady, Ms. Alice SHAM, had regular meetings with Hospital Authority (HA) and successfully securing specialty training sites in several HA hospitals for 4 Academy Colleges. As a majority of Academy Colleges have enrolled to have their Membership Programme Assessment in 2017, Ms. SHAM and the panel members would be busy in conducting the assessment throughout 2017. Upon successful assessment, Ms. SHAM would continue to negotiate with HA to have more specialty training sites open for other Academy Colleges.

The committee also had numerous meetings with

other stakeholders such as Department of Health, Private Hospitals and Universities Nursing Heads in promoting the advanced nursing practice and its specialty training.

A visit trip to the University of Newcastle and the Australian Nursing & Midwifery Accreditation Council from 26 February to 3 March 2017 had assured the participants that the Academy was on the right direction in achieving its goal. We look forward to more collaboration between the Academy and two organizations in the near future.

Accreditation Committee

Chairlady, Ms. Alice SHAM had led its members in conducting re-accreditation exercises for six Colleges and they had successfully re-accredited as Academy Colleges in 2017 for a period of 1-3 years, namely, the Hong Kong College of Community & Public Health Nursing; College of Critical Care Nursing; College of Gerontology; College of Mental Health Nursing; College of Midwives and College of Surgical Nursing.

Professional Development Committee

Chairlady, Ms. Serena LI, has been leading the Academy in successfully re-accredited as Provider of Continuous Nursing Education for a period of 3 years from 12 September 2016 to 11 September 2019 by the Nursing Council of Hong Kong. Ms. LI and the committee members are designing and developing nursing health tips in managing and caring various health issues to be uploaded in the HKAN website. The call for submission of CNE cycle record from April 2014 to March 2017 was made and the next CNE cycle would be from April 2017 to March 2020.

Registration & Membership Committee

Chairman, Mr. Alick CHIU, announced that there were 2920 Fellow members renewed their membership as at 31 October 2016 and the call for renewal in 2017/18 is in progress. The Academy welcomed 14 Ordinary Members admission from 4 Academy Colleges for 2016/17 and 16 Fellow Members admission from 5 Academy Colleges for conferment on 13 May 2017.

Promotion and Public Relations Committee

Chairlady, Dr. Esther WONG, had led 150 nurses and health care professionals to complete the 13 chapters of Community Involved Broadcasting Service (CIBS) Project 2015-2016 "健康老友記雜誌" since April 2016 to the last broadcast on 6 July 2016. This was well received by the public and sharing sessions were conducted on 9 June and 22 November 2016 respectively. The HKAN Fellowship Network, a platform for sharing among HKAN Fellows, was conducted on 29 October 2016.

As a promotion and public relations activity, Dr. WONG organized a Cantonese Opera cum Health Consultation activity "護粵韻傳萬家 體檢及健康諮詢暨粵曲欣賞會" on 19 February 2017, sponsored by the HK Financial Centre Rotary Club. 14 Colleges with over 50 Fellows involved in the health check for 610 participants. It is anticipated this activity will be organized again.

Community and Fund Raising Committee

Apart from the Charity Nourishing Feast mentioned above, the chairlady, Dr. Alice TSO also held the WHO Health Carnival Day on 8 April 2017 in Tuen Mun Civic Square with over 5000 public participants. It was co-organized with Faculty of Health & Social Science (FHSS), the Hong Kong Polytechnic University; New Territories West Cluster, Hospital Authority and the Department of Health. The theme this year was "Depression: Let's talk" and we were honored to have artist, Ms. LAM Yan Tung (林欣彤小姐) and psychiatrist, Dr. TSANG Fan Kwong (曾繁光醫生) to share their experiences. Community talks continued throughout the year 2016/17. Our forthcoming event for fund raising activity will be "Walk for Fun" to be held in November 2017.

The Hong Kong Academy of Nursing has admitted Professor CHANG Anne Marie as an Honorary Fellow.

Prof. Anne CHANG completed her nurse training in 1965 at the Royal Adelaide Hospital in South Australia. Her role as a teacher and developer of university programmes for nurses began after 10 years of clinical nursing experience in Australia and United Kingdom. Prof. CHANG's role as an educator, initially in a hospital based school of nursing followed by teaching and coordination at Queensland University of Technology, equipped her for consultancy work with the Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK) in the establishment of the first post-registration nursing degree in Hong Kong. Prof. CHANG as a senior member of staff in the new Department of Nursing at CUHK, undertook the planning and scheduling for the new Bachelor of Nursing programme which began in 1991. Success of this programme led to expansion with the commencement of the 4-year pre-registration Bachelor of Nursing in 1995, which Prof. CHANG also developed in collaboration with department staff as well as colleagues from the acute and community clinical settings. As a member of staff at CUHK Department of Nursing from its commencement until 2002, she was also involved in development of master degree level programmes.

Prof. CHANG's strong commitment to ensuring education and research programmes for nurses were clinically focussed led to her joint professorial appointment with Mater Hospital and QUT on her return to Australia in 2002. Her continuing research interest in promoting self-management in those with chronic disease began with her PhD at the CUHK which investigated the role of nurses in promoting stroke survivors' self-esteem. Prof. CHANG's dedication to advancing the role of clinical nurses and promoting practice based on evidence led to her appointment as Director of the Queensland Centre for Evidence-Based Nursing & Midwifery, a collaborating centre of Joanna Briggs Institute. Her scholarly work in Hong Kong and Australia included research, PhD supervision and publication of papers in international journals, involvement in professional organisations included membership of the Hong Kong College of Nursing and fellowship with the Australian College of Nursing.

Ms. CHUNG Shuk Tze Lucy



The Hong Kong Academy of Nursing has admitted Ms. CHUNG Shuk Tze Lucy as an Honorary Fellow.

Ms. Chung completed her nursing training in 1979 at Caritas Medical Center in Hong Kong. She is the first Hong Kong nurse who attained a Master degree in Hospice and Palliative Care in the United Kingdom. Immediately after her return to Hong Kong in 1982, she was invited to initiate the first Palliative Care Team at Our Lady of Maryknoll Hospital. She worked hand in hand with Sister Helen Kenny and Dr. Yu Wing Kwong, and their pioneer service laid the foundation of Palliative Care in Hong Kong.

In 1992, Ms. Chung was appointed Nursing Director of the Bradbury Hospice, which was established by the Society for the Promotion of Hospice Care, a charitable organization founded in 1986 to promote hospice care in Hong Kong.

She pioneered palliative nursing in Hong Kong with a mission to improve the quality of care for the terminally-ill cancer patients and end-of-life care.

In appreciation of Ms. Chung's dedication, commitment and leadership in the development of the hospice and palliative care, she was granted an award as one of the "Ten Outstanding Young Persons" by the Junior Chamber International Hong Kong (JCIHK) in 1993.

In order to promote palliative nursing in Hong Kong, Ms. Chung supported the establishment of the Hong Kong Hospice Nurses' Association which is currently named as Hong Kong Palliative Nursing Association. She was the Advisor and now the Patron of the Association to build up the competency of palliative care for nurses. Ms. Chung had been actively involved in the curriculum development of the palliative nursing care both in Hospital Authority and other Professional Associations.

Currently, Ms. Chung serves the community through her work in family therapy, trauma healing and spiritual direction, and continues to provide training in palliative care, therapeutic communication, counseling, bereavement, trauma care and spiritual direction.

Ms. TAM Kam Yuk Sylvania

The Hong Kong Academy of Nursing has admitted Ms. TAM Kam Yuk Sylvania as an Honorary Fellow.

Ms. Sylvania TAM graduated from The School of General Nursing, Queen Elizabeth Hospital in 1966. She had worked in various hospitals including Queen Elizabeth Hospital, Princess Margaret Hospital, Prince of Wales Hospital, Tuen Mun Hospital as well as St. Paul's Hospital. She had vast experiences in nursing and management in both public and private sectors. Before her retirement from Hospital Authority (HA) in 2004, Ms. Sylvania TAM was the Cluster General Manager (Nursing) of New Territories West Cluster & General Manager (Nursing) Tuen Mun Hospital (TMH).

Throughout her career, Ms. TAM has shouldered numerous leading and pioneer roles and her contributions to nursing were countless. While she was the Senior Nursing Officer (1991-1993) and later Department Operations Manager (1993-1997) of Accident and Emergency Department (AED) of TMH, she established the first Radiation Emergency Centre in Hong Kong to handling the radiation hazards from Daya Bay China and was one of first nurse trainers for Radiation Emergency Course for all HA staff. Besides, she organized the first Disaster Drill Exercise between Ambulance Services of Fire Service Department of Hong Kong Government and AED HA which has now become the regular drill exercise in preparing and enhancing the skills and collaboration of staff from both organizations to handling disaster accidents. Ms. TAM also set up the first AED volunteer Services to provide immediate support to needy victims. As the General Manager (Nursing) in TMH (1997-2002), she contributed to the smooth transfer of 6 General Out-Patient Clinics from Department of Health to Hospital Authority. As the Cluster General Manager (Nursing) (2002-2004), she led the team to combat SARS pandemic in 2003 and effectively rebuilt hospital services in TMH afterwards. All along Ms. TAM was the strong advocate of customer services. She actively promoted quality services for the community and was the organizer of the Intercompany Quality Symposium with MTR, KCR, China Gas Co, EMSG and TMH. She was also the first nursing leader to provide input in developing the training package of customer service for all grades of HA staff. With her commitment and inspiration, TMH was recognized as the quality hospital actively involved in the International Quality Symposium presentations since 1998.

After her retirement from HA, being the Quality & Risk Project Manager in Hong Kong Anti-Cancer Society Jockey Club Cancer Rehabilitation Centre and Nursing Manager in St. Paul's Hospital, she made significant contributions in building up quality and safety programs and achieving the successful qualification of Trent Accreditation and Department of Health Licensing. Currently, Ms. TAM is the coordinator for Integrated Chinese and Western Medicine (ICWM) project for Yan Oi Tong Chinese Medicine Centre and successfully facilitates the in-patients to receive safe and quality ICWM. Besides, she also contributes to the volunteer services of Auxiliary Medical Services and St John Brigade and Association.

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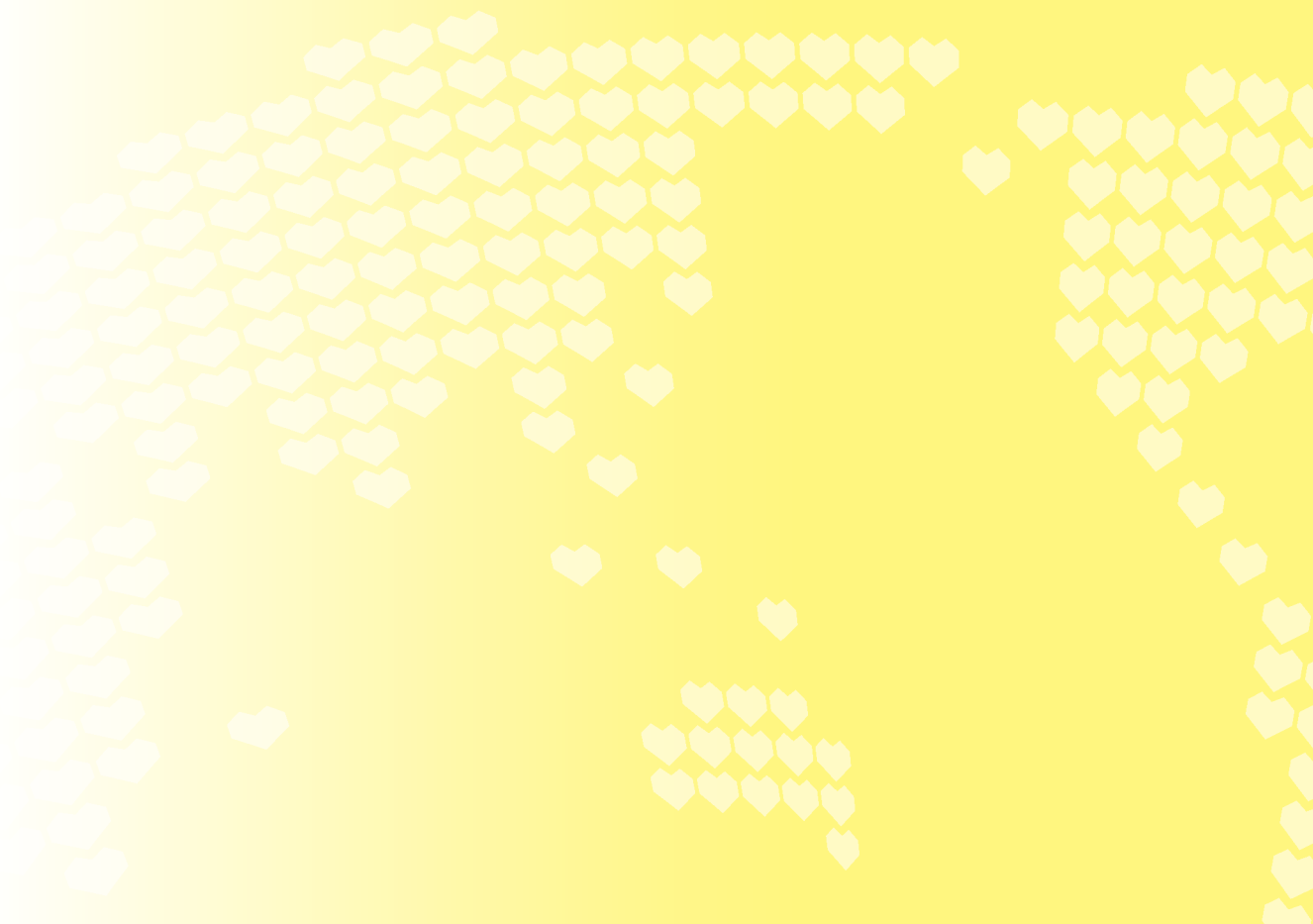

Angela Barron McBride is Distinguished Professor and University Dean Emeritus at Indiana University School of Nursing. Her leadership experience includes serving as president of Sigma Theta Tau International during the building of the International Center for Nursing Scholarship in Indianapolis. 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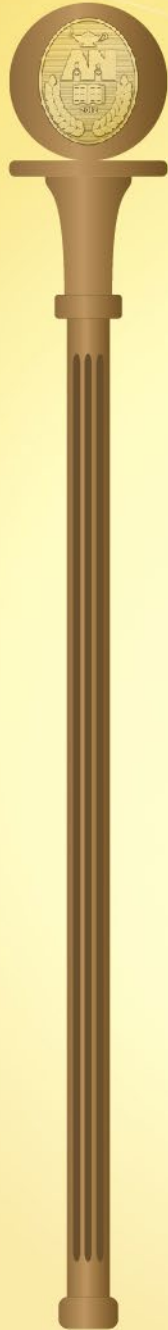
## Abstract

### Keynote Address:

#### "Leadership and Degrees of Impact"

This presentation describes changing perceptions of what it means to work as a nurse — from having a job to having a career; from having a career to making an impact. Not only are five key transitions in a career explained, but degrees of impact are sketched out, from becoming skilled and knowledgeable to building a nursing reputation then an inter-professional reputation. Each nurse operates in a different setting and over a different period of time, but the question each must ask is, "What impact do I want to have?"





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
