PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

This is a day of celebration of achievements, and yet another new day in building the past in the advancement of nursing in the future in Hong Kong. The Hong Kong Academy of Nursing is embarking on the 7th year of her journey striving for one single mission, that is, to attain regulatory status of advanced practising nurses for the protection of the public and advancement of the profession. Sir Winston Churchill once said, 'The longer you look back, the farther you can look forward'. The contributions of the six very prominent individuals who are conferred as Honorary Fellows this year speak to this. Each of them represents an important part of the larger picture of nursing in search of excellence, striving to provide higher quality of care for the people we serve. They have helped build our past to provide a solid ground for us to create our future.

The Academy has done a substantial amount of work in the last few years in constructing specialty curriculum for all specialties led by 14 Academy Colleges endorsed by the Education Committee of the Academy. We have conducted vigorous assessment exercises, and today you are witnessing the third year when we yield fruits from the certification mechanism with a total of 26 earned Fellows from 8 Academy Colleges. We already have a system in place and I can foresee that the system will become more mature in the coming years, with a plan that we would benchmark the standards of advanced nursing practice in Hong Kong with other regions and international counterparts including Mainland China, Canada and Australia that the Academy has already made connections with.

Now we have a system in place, why is it so urgent to gain statutory status for advanced practising nurses? It is urgent because we need to have protection for the public and nurses practising at advanced level. Hong Kong has a mature system in confirming the standards of entry registered nurses by admitting them into the profession and preventing them from practice if they are found unfit for practice. Healthcare and technology are developing quickly these days. For the benefits of the patients, all healthcare professionals are embarking on more advanced practice that require further training and reassurance of the competence when performed upon patients. If we do not have a regulatory system for advanced nursing practice, we are either deterring our nurses from doing more to address the needs of the patients or putting our patients at risk by not doing the due diligence to protect the public if the nurses provide care in their extended and expanded role without standardised training and certification of the competence. We have a critical mass of nurses who aspire to do more and better. We have universities that provide clinical master programs working with the Academy to align the curricula to provide post-graduate education for nurses. What we need is gaining statutory status of the Academy to have a complete closure of service, education and regulation for a healthy professional milieu in Hong Kong.

I extend my heartfelt congratulations to all 26 Fellows today who well deserve the honor they have earned. I express appreciation to the Honorary Fellows who have helped build our past to provide a solid ground for us to create the future. This is a happy day to celebrate and especially for the College Presidents, mentors and the supervisors, a day that you should be proud of. The success of Fellows reflects your relentless efforts of coaching and encouragement in nurturing the younger generation.

Enjoy a happy Nurses' Day and share the joy of the event. Wishing you all health and happiness!

The HKAN is charged with the responsibility to regulate the practices of Advanced Practice Nurses, to safeguard the public's right and to receive safe and quality health care services.

Mission


- 1. To establish a statutory credentialing system to protect the safety of the public and to legitimize advanced nursing practice;

Membership in 2018

1. Institutional Member

HKAN has recognized 14 Academy Colleges as Institutional Members. These are registered organizations providing certification of individuals as advanced practice nurses in specialties recognized by the HKAN.

2. Ordinary Member

We are pleased to have the third group of Ordinary Members admitted from Hong Kong College of Critical Care Nursing, College of Education and Research in Nursing, College of Emergency Nursing, College of Medical Nursing, College of Midwives, College of Nursing & Health Care Management, College of Paediatric Nursing and College of Surgical Nursing in 2017 as they have satisfied the specialty training curriculum and examination as stipulated by the colleges. There are a total of 45 Ordinary Members as at 31 December 2017.

3. Fellow Member

Since 2017, HKAN has admitted Fellow Members by examination and assessment conducted by individual colleges. There are a total of 2,775 Fellow Members as at 31 December 2017.

We are pleased to have 26 Fellow Members admitted from Hong Kong College of Critical Care Nursing, College of Education and Research in Nursing, College of Emergency Nursing, College of Medical Nursing, College of Midwives, College of Nursing & Health Care Management, College of Paediatric Nursing and College of Surgical Nursing in 2018.

4. Honorary Fellow Member

HKAN takes great pride to have admitted renowned individuals as Honorary Fellows who have contributed to the establishment of the Academy and had offered their expertise to enhance the development of professional nursing locally and internationally. Including the 6 Honorary Fellows conferred this year, there are a total of 41 Honorary Fellows in 2018.

2018 Fellowship Conferment

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Achievements and Events 2017/2018

In the immediate past year, the Hong Kong Academy of Nursing (HKAN) continues to broaden and deepen its work and builds impacts in the community.

The Charity Chinese Opera "The Legend of Purple Hairpin (紫釵記)" organized by HKAN was held on 10 December 2017. Ms. Cynthia HUIE-ROSE, Fellow of HKAN (Cardiac) played the role of protagonist in this opera and her family, the ROSE Family, has rendered full support financially and operationally to the event. The contribution and generosity of the ROSE family is highly appreciated. A sum of over \$500,000 was raised.

The annual Strategic Planning Workshop was held on 20 January 2018 in Sai Kung. This year the theme was "Sustainable Development for Hong Kong Academy of Nursing". It was well attended by 57 representatives from 14 Academy Colleges. Dr. CHUI Tak Yi, Acting Secretary for Food and Health graced the event and provided encouraging remarks. The participants had good discussions, sincere sharing and constructive recommendations. At the end, the President, Prof. Frances WONG drew up 4 strategic foci namely 1) Positioning, 2) Partnership, 3) Passing on and 4) Power for follow up action.

Prof. Frances WONG and Ms. Alice SHAM represented the Academy to attend The Fifth International Congress on Professional and Occupational Regulation organized by Council on Licensure, Enforcement & Regulation (CLEAR) on 16-17 November 2017 in Melbourne, Australia, with the objectives to learn about the international experience and perspectives of advanced education and accreditation/regulation of professionals. Ms. Alice SHAM conducted a talk on "Professional Regulation: an International Perspective from CLEAR" on 3 March 2018 to share the learning points from this Congress with Fellows and Members.

Development of Specialization of Nursing Practice in Hong Kong

The Task Force on Specialization of Nursing Practice set up by the Food and Health Bureau held regular meetings with the Academy, Hospital Authority (HA) and Department of Health (DH) to discuss on the future development of specialization of nursing practice in Hong Kong. The Bureau in the 3rd meeting instructed the Nursing Council of Hong Kong (NCHK) to set up a work group to deliberate on the following: 1) to prescribe guidelines on the scope of practice or/and core competencies of nurses with advanced expertise and standards, 2) to devise a mechanism by setting training standards and recognizing training institutes and 3) to explore the feasibility of setting up a mechanism for advanced practice register under NCHK.

Besides, HKAN had regular meetings with HA and initiated the review and alignment of learning objectives, logbook with clinical objectives set by HA and HKAN. HKAN also initiated the pilot of experiential learning in the 4 specialties of Critical Care, Medical, Paediatrics and Obstetrics.

Active Participation in Promoting Primary Health Care in the Community

In response to the Chief Executive's Policy Address 2017-2018 on the issue of enhancing Primary Healthcare in the community, Prof. Frances WONG was invited to present the view of HKAN at the respective Consultative Meeting on 8 August 2017.

In this connection, Prof. Frances WONG and Dr. Susie LUM were interviewed by RTHK to give views on the establishment and development of Nurse Clinics in the community.

Prof. Frances WONG has been invited by Food and Health Bureau to join the Steering Committee on Primary Health Care Development and to chair the Sub-group on Community Engagement.

A regular meeting with the Hong Kong Alliance of Patients' Organization (HKAPO) (香港病人組織聯盟) chaired by Mr. YUEN Siu Lam (袁少林主席) was held on 18 January 2018. The organization

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strongly supported the setting up of the District Health Centre (社區康健中心) and affirmed her trust in the care under the Advanced Practice Nurses. A joint statement of HKAN and HKAPO on the need of District Health Centre and the importance of nursing contribution together with a multidisciplinary team was submitted to Food and Health Bureau and the Steering Committee on Primary Healthcare Development on 6 March 2018 and 9 March 2018 respectively.

To support the "Alcohol Fails Campaign", a position statement from HKAN was sent to the media on 2 October 2017 with a view to alert the public on the harmful use of Alcohol. Besides, Department of Health (DH) invited Prof. Frances WONG to promote the "Alcohol Fails Campaign" through a video on 8 November 2017 for public promotion.

Apart from cosigning the letter with Hong Kong Council on Smoking and Health (COSH) on tobacco control for supporting raising tobacco tax by 100% in 2018/2019 budget, HKAN also supported the advocacy of "Not Accepting Sponsorship from Tobacco Industry".

Throughout the year, HKAN continues to promulgate and educate the public in all functions to promote organ donation.

Local Networking and Collaboration

To enhance collaboration with our working partners, HKAN took turn and hosted the joint meeting with the Heads of School of Nursing of the 4 universities. Together they issued a joint statement on 13 October 2017 to comment on the healthcare policy of the Chief Executive' Policy 2017-2018.

Fraternity meetings with Nursing Heads of HA hospitals and private hospitals were held on 19 September 2017 and 16 December 2017 respectively. One of the goals was to update the nursing heads on the development of HKAN and seek their support for the training requirements required by the Academy Colleges for Fellowship Exit Examination.

Prof. Frances WONG was invited to attend the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine (HKAM) Council Dinner on 27 July 2017.

International Networking and Collaboration

In the past year, HKAN participated actively to enhance local and regional collaboration, namely the 8th Specialized Summit on Advanced Nursing Practice in Guangzhou (第八屆廣東省專科護理高級實踐大會), the 13th National People's Congress Election (中華人民共和國香港特別行政區第十三屆全國人民代表大會代表選舉), the First Guangdong, Hong Kong and Macao Bay Area Health and Health Cooperation Conference (首屆粵港澳大灣區衛生與健康合作大會) of which Prof. Frances WONG was appointed Consultant (衛生與健康專家顧問).

In addition, HKAN was invited by Guangdong Provincial Nursing Education Center (廣東省護理教育中心) and Guangdong Provincial Nurse Association (廣東省護士協會) on 28 October 2017 to work together on a collaborative study of Advance Practice Nurse (APN) of Guangdong and Hong Kong. Six HKAN Academy Colleges were included in the study, namely, College of Medical Nursing, College of Paediatric Nursing, College of Surgical Nursing, College of Nursing and Health Care Management and College of Midwives and College of Mental Health Nursing. The study would compare the APN practices in the dimensions of structure, process and outcomes in Guangdong and Hong Kong at an advanced level.

Education Committee

The Committee has conducted a total of ten Program Assessments in 2017. A majority of Academy Colleges passed the Assessments and proceeded to conduct Membership Examinations and Fellowship Exit Examinations. The Committee continues to refine the Guidelines for Program Planning and Examination to guide future practice.

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Accreditation Committee

The Committee conducted re-accreditation exercises on 3 February 2018 for five Colleges. The following Colleges have been successfully re-accredited in 2018 for a period of 1-3 years, namely, the Hong Kong College of Gerontology Nursing, College of Medical Nursing, College of Nursing and Health Care Management, College of Orthopaedic Nursing and College of Perioperative Nursing.

Professional Development Committee

Health Tips submitted by the Colleges were uploaded onto the HKAN website. The Committee conducted the following PDC activities for the year 2017/18:

- 1. Workshop on "Embedding Competency Standards and Assessment in Advanced Nursing Practice" by Dr. Marie GERDTZ and Ms. Natasha MORRIS, University of Melbourne, Australia, was co-organized with The University of Hong Kong on 30 September 2017.
- 2. Talk on "A Snap Shot of Nurse Practitioners Development in Australia" by Prof. Sally CHAN, University of Newcastle, Australia on 21 October 2017.
- 3. 「粵港兩地專家會議」jointly organized by HKAN and Guangdong Provincial Nursing Education Center (廣東省護理教育中心) and Guangdong Provincial Nurse Association (廣東省護士協會) on 28 October 2017 at Beijing University Shenzhen Hospital (北京大學深圳醫院).
- 4. Talk on "Professional Regulation: an International Perspective from CLEAR (Council on Licensure, Enforcement & Regulation)" by Ms. Alice SHAM on 3 March 2018.

Registration & Membership Committee

There were 2,775 Fellow membership renewed as of 31 December 2017. The call for renewal in 2018/19 is in progress. The restoration of Fellow membership was announced through the HKAN website. The Academy admitted 38 Ordinary Members from 7 Academy Colleges for 2017/2018, and 26 Fellow Members from 8 Academy Colleges for conferment on 12 May 2018.

Co-chair of Community and Fund Raising Committee and Promotion and Public Relations Committee

A community program「護專關愛傳萬家」was held at Shamshuipo district. Dr. Margaret LAM, Fellow of HKAN (Primary Health) delivered the health talk on "Health Tips on Safe and Correct Handling of Medication at Home" on 26 October 2017. More than 200 elders attended this activity.

An ongoing community program 「護專扶輪、老友所護:愛老護腦大行動」jointly organized with Rotary Club of Hong Kong Financial Centre for 18 districts was kicked off on 13 January 2018 for Yau Tsim Mong District with the presence of Dr. CHUI Tak Yi, Acting Secretary for Food and Health. A survey will be conducted on the health related needs of the public in the 18 districts. The study results will help inform future planning of primary healthcare development in the community particularly in the area of care-taking of older adults with cognitive impairment.

This year, the 2018 Health Carnival was held at Wong Tai Sin Square on 7 April 2018 with Secretary for Food and Health as officiating guest and artiste Ms. LAW Lan (羅蘭女士) and Cantonese opera performer Ms. Candy WAI (衛駿輝女士) as Health Ambassadors. The guest shared their experiences on staying healthy. The theme was "身心護理做得好,全民健康必達到". The Carnival was well attended by over 2,000 public participants.

The "Youth Caring Program (青少年關愛計劃)" in collaboration with UpPotential Ltd., with the aim to instill positive thinking, resilience building and manage stress of students has been rolled out to more schools. The responses were good. The health promotion talks in the program were supported by the Hong Kong College of Paediatric Nursing.

The Hong Kong Academy of Nursing has admitted Ms. CHING Tai Yin Patricia, MH as Honorary Fellow.

Ms. CHING began her nursing training in the Queen Mary Hospital (QMH) in 1967. After graduation, she worked as registered nurse in QMH, thereafter she received a wide range of training both locally and overseas, viz the Midwifery, Intensive Care Nursing, Coronary Care Nursing and Infection Control. She completed a course on Diploma of Nursing Administration in 1989.

Ms. CHING worked in the Intensive Care Unit in QMH for 10 years before she became the nurse-in-charge of the Infection Control Unit for the next 24 years. With her dedication and achievements, she was appointed as Clinical Nurse Specialist and further promoted to be Senior Nursing Officer in 2007 as well as Accreditation Manager in the Quality and Safety Department in Hong Kong West Cluster for the period 2010 to 2012.

Ms. CHING was appointed as Senior Nurse, World Health Organization (WHO) Collaborating Centre, Hospital Authority, Hong Kong for infection control, outbreak education and research in 2010. She was also invited by many Infection Control Associations as their respective Faculty Member. She was responsible for organizing numerous conferences and workshops in the past 30 years. With her strong leadership and dedication, she set up many basic and advanced infection control standards, change of practice for the better clinical outcomes, especially during the outbreak of SARS. With the implementation of these new practices, the standards of infection control in Hong Kong had a big leap forward. Ms. CHING is a Certified Practitioner in Healthcare Quality (CPHQ) of Health Quality Certification Board of the National Association for Healthcare Quality, USA since 1997. She also took part in the infection control training and has been very active in conducting clinical researches. The findings of which had been published both locally and internationally. She was conferred the Honorary Professor conferred of the Military Post-graduate Medical School, Chinese People Liberal Army General Hospital, Beijing in 1995.

Ms. CHING has been given many renowned awards to recognize her contributions in infection control. She was recognized as the outstanding staff of Hospital Authority in 2002. She was also awarded the Hong Kong West Gold Badge Award for SARS in 2003, Medal of Honor by Hong Kong Government in 2004, Chief Executive's Commendation for Community Service in 2009.

Ms. CHING is grandfather fellow of Hong Kong Academy of Nursing (Medical) and has been very supportive to the development of our Academy and Hong Kong College of Medical Nursing.

Dr. KO Wing Man, GBS, BBS, JP



The Hong Kong Academy of Nursing has admitted Dr. KO Wing Man, GBS, BBS, JP as Honorary Fellow.

Dr. KO graduated from the Faculty of Medicine, University of Hong Kong in 1981. He began his career at The Princess Margaret Hospital and received a fellowship from the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh in 1986. Dr. KO received his master degree in Health Administration from the University of New South Wales in 1992. He became a fellow of Orthopaedic Surgery at The Hong Kong Academy of Medicine (1993); a fellow of the Community Medicine (2000), and was granted fellowship of the Faculty of Public Health Medicine at The Royal College of Physicians (2001). He was awarded with BBS in 2008 and GBS in 2017.

He joined the Hospital Authority (HA) in 1991 and served as Director of Professional Services & Public Affairs and Director of Professional Services and Human Resources when he left HA in 2004. He acted as the acting Chief Executive of HA during the SARS outbreak in 2003. Under his leadership, the united dedicated professional efforts of all staff in HA to combat the SARS was well reflected. HA succeeded to overcome formidable challenges hence safeguarding the city's public health. Dr. KO became Chairman of the Hong Kong Anti-Cancer Society in 2005 and subsequently took up the Director of the Hong Kong Red Cross. He contributed greatly in the rehabilitation and reconstruction of Sichuan after the 2008 earthquake.

Dr. KO served as the Secretary for Food and Health from 2012 to 2017. Being particularly concerned about the increasing demand for healthcare services due to global ageing, he started a steering committee to review Hong Kong's healthcare system which involved manpower planning as well as professional training and development. He was elected as member of the National Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference in 2018.

Over the years, Dr. KO has given relentless support to the nursing profession as Secretary for Food and Health. He gave good advice to enhancing the professionalism of the industry and helped in the materialization of various nursing initiatives.

Mr. KWAN Kin Boon Aaron

The Hong Kong Academy of Nursing has admitted Mr. KWAN Kin Boon Aaron as Honorary Fellow.

Mr. KWAN began his nursing training in Queen Mary Hospital (QMH) in 1974. After graduation, he worked as a registered nurse in QMH in various units. His initial intention to work as a nurse was to explore human emotions which he could apply to his early childhood interest in arts. However, his love of nursing grew at the first day he encountered patient care.

In order to improve his nursing knowledge, he visited the medical library, subscribed periodicals and nursing journals, and insatiably acquired the experiences from the senior nurses.

While he worked in the University Surgical Unit, he was nominated to study specialty training in stoma care, wound care, and incontinence care in United Kingdom.

In 1980, he became the first Enterostomal Nurse. He also took an extra duty to look after patients with Total Parenteral Nutrition (TPN).

With his expertise and dedication in improving the quality care for the patients, he was assigned to set up the first Enterostomal Therapy Service in QMH in 1982, two Outpatient clinics in Sai Ying Poon and Tang Chi Ngong, to provide hospital-wide independent nurse consultation. This service covered majority departments in QMH as well as referrals from all other hospitals in Hong Kong. Mr. KWAN set up the foundation of Enterostomal specialty nursing 35 years ago.

Mr. KWAN emigrated with his family to Canada in 1990. He made a major change in his role and career after finishing the Bachelor of Science in Nursing and simultaneously taking Fine Art courses in University of British Columbia in 1993. Since then, he became a full time artist and an art educator for more than 25 years. In return, his teaching people with special needs in art and design is an extension of nursing career.

With Mr. KWAN's initial efforts to introduce the Stoma Care in Hong Kong, the specialty has been developed rapidly with high quality patient care and international recognition.

Mrs. LEE Liv



The Hong Kong Academy of Nursing has admitted Mrs. LEE Liv as Honorary Fellow.

Norway in 1962 and a certificate course on Public Health Personnel in Oslo two years later. Mrs. Liv LEE started to work in Hong Kong in 1965, participating in medical projects run by the Methodist Church. She became a registered nurse of Hong Kong in 1968 and of the United Kingdom in 1980. She was one of the few nurses pioneering Community Nursing in Hong Kong,

In 1970s Mrs. LEE Liv introduced the community nursing service to a number of subvented hospitals namely Our Lady of Maryknoll Hospital; Haven of Hope Hospital; The Caritas Medical Centre; Alice Ho Miu Ling Nethersole Hospital; later the project was commenced at the United Christian Hospital.

Mrs. LEE Liv stayed with Community Nursing at Nethersole Hospital and at The Yang Memorial Social Centre until 1974. She helped out in training a number of qualified local community nurses during her stay. After leaving the Yang's she worked as an agency nurse in the hospital of Kai Tak North Refugee Camp. She provided counselling services to problems relating to spouse abuse, unwanted pregnancies, bereavement and depression while working with a mental health programme: "Family life Service" for Vietnamese refugees, from 1980 to 1984.

Apart from community nursing, Mrs. LEE Liv also worked as volunteer for the underprivileged groups. She was included in projects for the abused domestic helpers (1988-1990) and the homeless (2009-2013).

Through years' effort, the idea of providing nursing care to people discharged from hospitals eventually gained the government acceptance.

Professor Ida MARTINSON

The Hong Kong Academy of Nursing has admitted Prof. Ida MARTINSON as Honorary Fellow.

Prof. Ida MARTINSON received her baccalaureate nursing education at the University of Minnesota in 1960. She obtained her doctorate degree at the University of Illinois in 1972. She has been a full professor since 1977 at University of Minnesota, then University of California, San Francisco. She was the Department Head at the School of Nursing at the Hong Kong Polytechnic University from 1996 to 2000. She is also a Visiting Professor in a number of universities including Sun Yat Sen University in Mainland China, National Defense Medical Center in Taiwan and EWHA Woman's University in Korea.

She has received numerous awards, namely The American Cancer Society Outstanding Service Award in 1975; the American Journal of Nursing book of the year award in 1987; the Sigma Theta Tau Audrey Hepburn Award in 1999; Leading the Way Award by the Hospice and Palliative Nurses Association in 2010.

She was also admitted as Fellows of the American Academy of Nursing in 1977 and member of the Institute of Midwives in 1981 and an Honorary Degree of doctorate of Humanities from the Hong Kong Polytechnic University in 2010.

Prof. MARTINSON wrote books and disseminated knowledge in contribution to the science of nursing. She published 140 research articles and dozens of book chapters. Much of her research has resulted in concrete applications to the development of nurse-directed systems of care. The three most important of these are (1) pioneer published application in hospice care for seriously ill children to die at home instead of the hospital, (2) the concept in the Block Nurse Program for the Elderly and its development in the U.S., and (3) the establishment of the Childhood Cancer Foundation which whereby free chemotherapy was given the newly diagnosed children with cancer before national health insurance coverage in Taiwan.

Ms. SO Chui Kuen Cecilia



The Hong Kong Academy of Nursing has admitted Ms. SO Chui Kuen Cecilia as Honorary Fellow.

Ms. So worked as a registered nurse in Queen Mary Hospital (QMH) after graduating from its nursing school in 1969. She also completed her Midwifery training in Queen Elizabeth Hospital by 1971. She took no pay leave for attending the post-graduate Paediatric Nursing Course in the Birmingham Children's Hospital in England from 1971 to 1973. She was granted the title of Registered Sick Children Nurse by the General Nursing Council for England and Wales. She then worked in the Paediatric Department of QMH and was promoted to Nursing Officer in 1979.

Ms. SO was nominated as the course coordinator and instructor for the first "Paediatric & Neonatal Intensive Care Nursing Course" from 1982 to 1990. It paved the foundation in developing Paediatric Nursing in Hong Kong nowadays. Many Paediatric nurse experts and nursing management leaders were her students. She then worked in the Paediatric & Neonatal Intensive Care Unit of QMH until retirement.

Being inspired by the trade union movemention "equal pay, equal work for female and male nurses" issue, she was heavily involved in advocating professional development; pursuing of nursing welfare and benefits as well as improvement of the healthcare system and betterment of public health in Hong Kong.

From 1976 to 2012, Ms. SO took the chairmanship of the Nurses Branch, Hong Kong Chinese Civil Servants' Association (HKCCSA). Throughout the years, the Nurses Branch had marked achievements on issues such as patient nurse ratio and overtime compensation. She is currently the Vice President of HKCCSA and President of the Hong Kong Nurses General Union.

Ms. SO is the grandfather fellow (Paediatrics) of the Hong Kong Academy of Nursing and is very supportive to the development of the Academy and the Hong Kong College of Paediatric Nursing.

KEYNOTE SPEECH



Dr. CHEUNG Wai Lun Allen

Dr. CHEUNG Wai Lun Allen is currently the Project Director of the Chinese Medicine Hospital Project Office of the Food and Health Bureau. Before that, Dr. CHEUNG served as the Director (Cluster Services) of the Hospital Authority (HA) Head Office. As a prominent leader in HA he took charge of the Cluster Services Division and oversaw all service operation and development of the Medical grade, Nursing grade, Allied Health grade, Chief Pharmacist Office, Cluster Performance, Service transformation, Business Support Services, Chinese Medicine, Integrated Care Programs and Institute of Healthcare of the 7 clusters of HA. Despite shouldering a wide range of responsibilities, he provided tremendous support and visionary guidance and direction to nursing.

In recent 10 years, he led and expedited the development of nursing workforce and specialty nursing. He uplifted the standard of pre-registration and post-registration nursing training, expanded the scope of specialized nursing practice and established the Nurse Consultant position. He enhanced advanced nursing practice and steered the development of HA Nurse Clinics. Besides, he rationalized cluster boundary of Kowloon Central Cluster and Kowloon West Cluster and all specialty services. His contribution in enhancing the efficiency and effectiveness of the cluster services of HA is highly recognized. With his distinguished leadership, he won high respect from nurses and other healthcare professionals.
