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Message from President

Promoting the leading role of HKAN in advanced nursing practice (ANP) is always my objective. With the tremendous support from our Fellows, 17 articles on ANP have been published under the column of 護專世代 - 健康板 in Hong Kong Economic Journal (信報) since October 2020; 9 Academy Colleges were interviewed by 精靈一點 of RTHK and 9 "專科護理 3分鐘" videos have been posted on YouTube, Facebook and Instagram. Roles of ANP have been well promoted in these media presentations.



To be engaged globally, HKAN made the first attempt in the participation of the ICN-IND 2021 Photo Contest and the ICN-IND 2021 Weekly Case Story. They were excellent learning experiences to get ourselves better equipped for the next contests.

In addition, the 1st International Advanced Practice Nursing Virtual Conference in hybrid mode was successfully held on 22 and 23 May 2021. The response was overwhelming with 1157 attendees. 16 invited overseas and local renowned speakers shared their insights and experiences in advanced nursing practice, explored innovative strategies in shaping and enhancing health, and examined the critical roles of advanced practice nurses and midwives in addressing global health challenges, especially during the COVID-19 pandemic. Post conference feedback from attendees regarded the conference was excellent and fruitful. The overall satisfaction reached 99.25 %. A video produced by Department of Health (DH) at the conference promoting COVID-19 vaccination by nursing profession has been uploaded at DH and HKAN website.

HO As a commitment to public in delivering quality nursing services, HKAN was invited by the Food and Health Bureau to operate 2 Community Vaccination Centres (CVC) and to take up the unique role in providing on-going primary healthcare training to nurses of the District Health Centres (DHC). To demonstrate our leading role in the citywide vaccination program, HKAN collaborated with Hong Kong Academy of Medicine to offer the mandatory Online Training for COVID-19 Vaccination Program for nurses and doctors.

The HKAN has formed a Task Force for HKSAR Election Campaign in April 2021 and will participate in the process of Legislative Council (LegCo) election. The aim is to identify position of HKAN in the LegCo election, so as to formulate strategies to speed up statutory position for Hong Kong Academy of Nursing through 3 phases of election campaigns.

The pandemic is putting an unprecedented demand on the healthcare system overall and on nurses, in particular. Nurses have always been heroic, but today they are on the front lines of a war on world health. They are addressing the new challenges, working together to help everyone to get through the pandemic. Fellow Nurses, you are making a difference for so many people and their communities at large. Your significant contributions and positive impacts made by nurses, not only to the health care system but also to the health of everyone in Hong Kong and beyond. Voluntary Scheme on Advanced and Specialised Nursing Practice

The Food and Health Bureau invited the Nursing Council of Hong Kong (NCHK) to formulate a voluntary scheme on advanced and specialized nursing practice with a view to advance the professional competence of nurses and pave the way for setting up a statutory registration system in the long run. The NCHK recognized it is a global trend to promote advanced and specialised nursing practice and shouldered the responsibility for the professional development of nurses.

The Hong Kong Academy of Nursing (HKAN) and its Colleges have been invited to set up panels to formulate the relevant core competencies for 16 individual specialty. In May 2021, the core competencies of all specialties had been submitted to NCHK for endorsement.

Until June 2021, the following 8 Specialties were opened for application:

- 1) Gynaecology Nursing (27 Jan 2021)
- 2) Management in Nursing (27 Jan 2021)
- 3) Medical Nursing (22 Mar 2021)
- 4) Oncology Nursing (22 Mar 2021)
- 5) Orthopaedic Nursing (22 Mar 2021)
- 6) Paediatric Nursing (21 Jun 2021)
- 7) Emergency Care Nursing (21 Jun 2021)
- 8) Critical Care Nursing (21 Jun 2021)

The remaining 8 specialties core competencies would be opened for application gradually in coming months:

- 1) Cardiac Nursing
- 2) Community, Primary and Public Health Nursing
- 3) Education and Research in Nursing
- 4) Gerontology Nursing
- 5) Infection Control in Nursing
- 6) Mental Health Nursing
- 7) Perioperative and Anaesthesia Nursing
- 8) Surgical Nursing

The panel members appreciated the leadership of Prof. Frances WONG to this exercise and Prof. WONG expressed her heartful thanks to panel members for all the hard work and contributions to such important exercise for nursing in Hong Kong.

Congratulations to **Honorary Fellows 20**

This year, three Honorary Fellows were selected in recognition of their hard work and abundant contributions to nursing & healthcare profession.



Dr. Anecita P. FADOL Associate Professor University of Texas, MD Anderson Cancer Center

Dr. FADOL has made significant research and practice contributions in the evolving cardio-oncology specialty for the management of cardiovascular issues in cancer patients and survivors. She developed 7 educational materials for patients and nurses, presented at 47 national and 41 international conducted clinical research, published conferences. manuscripts in peer-reviewed journals, 10 book chapters.

Prof. JESTER has a track record of research and associated

publications in clinical research. She has led on a project with Danish colleagues to promote research capacity and capability building with nursing colleagues working in Orthopaedic settings in Denmark, she also led one of the first postgraduate Advanced Nurse Practitioner (ANP) courses in the UK (University of Birmingham) following a sabbatical to the United States to learn about ANP roles and their required academia and clinical practice since 1995.

Ms. WONG contributed a lot to the professional development and education of nurses and other healthcare workers. In view of her contribution and capability, she was appointed by NCHK to participate in various committees. She was also nominated for developing a New Syllabus for the transition of hospital-based nursing training to university education. 2003, Ms. WONG led a special group of nurses to develop a set of Infection Control Guidelines for healthcare professionals in DH in connection to the prevention of the spread of SARS in the community.

Community Vaccination Centres (CVC) Operated by HKAN

To support the territory-wide COVID-19 Vaccination Programme, the Government set up Community Vaccination Centres from early 2021 to provide vaccines for all Hong Kong

residents. With the last success of running the Universal Community Testing Program in Sept 2020, HKAN was invited again by the Department of Health (DH) to operate two CVCs at Tung Chung Community Hall and Hong Kong International Airport.



Prior to the operations, The Hong Kong Academy of Medicine (HKAM) and HKAN coorganized to produce an online training video for the vaccination program members. Continuous Nursing Education (CNE) points would be granted after successfully completed the training. Besides, Department of Pharmacology and Pharmacy, HKU, the Society of Hospital Pharmacists of Hong Kong and HKAN also jointly developed another online training program to support the operational details on reconstitution of Fosun/BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine.





Dress Rehearsals at the two CVCs were conducted on 12 March 2021 with 5 vaccine recipients at HK Airport CVC and 4 at Tung Chung CVC.







16 March 2021 was the open day of the two CVCs. The two centres can administer maximum 1,600 jabs a day. Eligible persons can reserve the time and place of their first and second doses via the Government's 24-hour online booking system.

Outreach Services

As invited by DH, HKAN had provided outreach service for Pricewaterhouse Coopers in its Central office on 8 Jun 2021. DH staff did an audit on the site in the afternoon and gave 100 full marks on the entire operations. The team vaccinated more than 370 employees, this was the largest number of people vaccinated in a company in a single day since the outreach service started.














The theme of the conference was "Nurses and Midwives - Catalyst for a Brighter Future in Health" highlighting our mission and commitment to catalyze nursing and health care transformation to achieve a brighter future in health for all.

International and local renowned and leading health care scholars, specialty nursing and midwifery experts were invited as keynote and plenary session speakers to share their nursing excellences in advanced nursing practice as well as to open the ways to support advanced nursing practice through nursing education, health care policies, research and management for developing, enhancing, shaping and advancing health. Another highlight of the conference was to examine the critical roles of advanced practice nurses and midwives in addressing global health challenges especially in the COVID-19 pandemic. Though it was only 2 days conference, it was expected to generate long-lasting impacts on advanced practice nursing and health care to benefit individuals, families and societies.



1st International Advanced Practice Nursing Conference 2021– 22nd May 2021 (1st day)

The 1st day program included 2 keynotes and 1 plenary session, followed by the panel discussion. Mr. David STEWART, keynote speaker from International Council of Nurses (ICN) shared with us the benefit to health care delivery through advanced nurse practitioners being given prescriptive right. However, varying global regulation, role confusion and lack of public awareness might hinder the development of this role. Dr. Melanie ROGERS believed ICN guidelines and clear policies could help to promote Advanced Nursing Practice worldwide. In the plenary session, Prof. WU Xinjuan, President of Chinese Nursing Association, Prof. CHAIR Sek Ying, President of HKAN and Ms Cecilia CHAN, Director of Nursing from Macao SAR, shared their experiences and insights on the development and transformation of advanced practice nursing. In the panel discussion, speakers highlighted how advanced nursing practice could lead to better health outcomes. Prof. Agnes TIWARI, chairman of Nursing Council of Hong Kong also shared the recent update on the implementation of the Voluntary Registration Scheme of Advanced and Specialized Practice in Hong Kong.

1st International Advanced Practice Nursing Conference 2021 – 23 May 2021 (2nd day)

The 2nd day of the Conference included 5 keynotes and 1 plenary session, followed by a round table discussion. Presidents of different academy colleges took up the moderator roles introducing their speakers and chairing the Q&A sessions. Prof. Jack NEEDLEMAN and Dr. Lynda TYER-VIOLA highlighted the lessons learned in COVID-19 due to great demands and changes to health care delivery system. Prof. David HUI gave an overview of COVID-19 in Hong Kong. The plenary speakers, Ms Mary FOONG and Mr. Lawrence POON from HKSAR, Prof. Shouzhen CHENG from Mainland China, Ms Weng-Sun WU from Macao, and Prof. Wen-Yu HU from Taiwan China and Dr. Alessandro STIVANO from Italy shared their experiences in combating COVID-19. All agreed that nurses were the major workforce in health care and played crucial role in coping the unprecedented COVID-19 challenges. In the round table discussion, speakers identified innovative strategies to better cope with global health challenges in the future. After the round table discussion, the keynotes from Prof. Rebecca JESTER on research and Dr. Christine PATCH on Genomic nursing were also very informative and enlightening.

Evaluation

The conference has 7 keynote sessions, 2 plenary sessions, 1 panel discussion and 1 round table discussion. The responses to the conference is overwhelming. The total nos. of registrants to this conference is 1,157 (from 10 countries/regions) including 1,135 nurses and 22 doctors.

From the evaluation returned from participants, the overall satisfaction reached 99.25 %, with 100% satisfied with the speakers' performance, 99% viewed the content was appropriate and practical, 95% satisfied with the duration of the conference and 99% satisfied with the webcast experience.

New Pathway to HKAN Membership and Fellowship

While taking an opportunity for the launch of the Voluntary Scheme by Nursing Council Hong Kong, HKAN revisited the pathway to achieve Fellowship with a view to welcome potential members. The New Pathway was implemented in May 2021.

- 18. Recommended by 2 Fellows of the Academy College of the related specialty
- 17. Passed the assessment stipulated by the Academy College of the related specialty
- 16. Completed the self-declaration of criminal conviction or professional misconduct*
- 15. Demonstrated significant contributions to nursing practice or service development
- 14. Achieved 60 CNE points within the recent 3-year cycle, with 45 points relating to the specialty
- 13. Completed the clinical log-book
- 12. Completed additional 250 hours of guided clinical practice
- 11. Accumulated 5 years of experience working in the specialty in recent 7 years
- 10. Passed the Certification Examination offered by the Academy College of the related specialty
- 9. Being an Ordinary Member of the HKAN and the Academy College of the related specialty
- 8. Possessed RN/RM registration in Hong Kong with a valid practising certificate

With the New Pathway effective from May 2021, the Academy would build up a stronger specialized nursing workforce for providing quality advanced nursing care to local populations that we serve.

The Manual for Program Planning and Examination was revised according to the new pathway and uploaded to HKAN website. Academy Colleges were also submitted their updated College Accreditation Handbooks and Program Handbooks. An jointly vetting exercise with Education Committee and Accreditation Committee was conducted on 17 April 2021 (Sat).




Professional Development Committee
